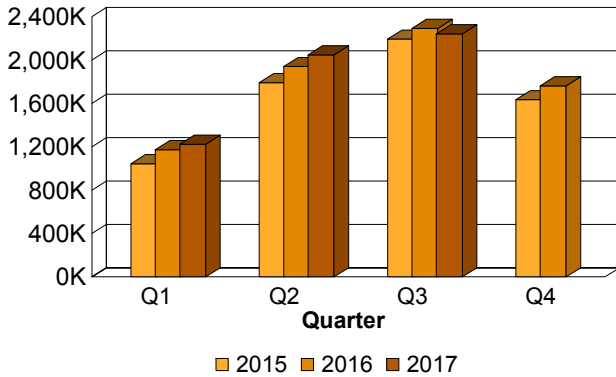


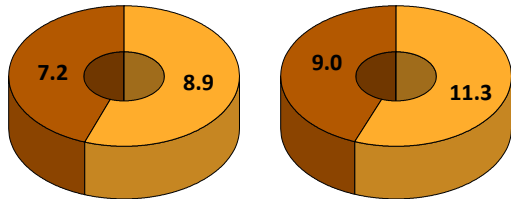

Visitor Arrivals to Mass./R.I./N. Hamp. by Quarter



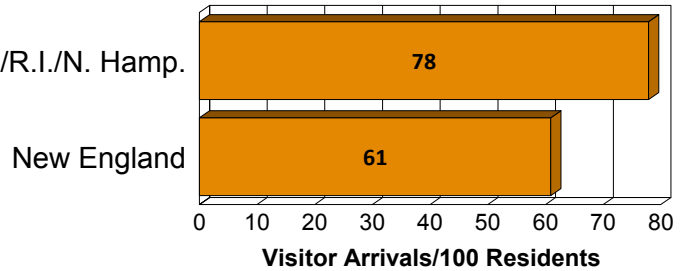
Passenger air travel represents an important source of visitation to most states and metropolitan areas. Visitors that travel by air tend to stay longer at their destination and spend more than other travelers. The summary of air travel data shown here provides an overview of the trends, seasonality and the relative importance of air travel. The specific origins where trips were initiated, competitive destinations and market penetration rates can be the focus of more detailed analyses.
